

Where Does it Say Jesus is God?

References to Christ's Divinity in the Old and New Testaments

- John 1:1-5, 14 – In the beginning was he Word
- Colossians 1:15-18 – By Him all things were created
- Hebrews 2:9-10 -- ...for whom are all things and through whom are all things
- John 8:57-59 – before Abraham was, I AM (see also Exodus 3:14)
- John 10:30 – I and the Father are one
- Matthew 9:2-8, Mark 2:1-12 – the Son of Man has authority to forgive sins
- Titus 2:13-14 -- ...our great God and Savior, Jesus Christ
- Hebrews 1:1-8 – His Son...through whom also He made the world
- John 20:26-29 – Thomas said, “My Lord and my God!”
- Isaiah 9:6-7 – and His name will be called Mighty God
- Micah 5:2-3 – from you One will go forth...from the days of eternity
- Revelation 1:8, 21:6, 22:13 – I AM the Alpha and Omega
- John 14:7-11 -- ...My Father, you have seen Him
- Matthew 26:63-66 – the priest declared His claims blasphemy
- Colossians 2:8-10 – in Him all the fullness of Deity dwells in bodily form
- Romans 9:5 – from whom is the Christ who is over all, God blessed forever
- Matthew 16:13-16 – you are the Christ, the Son of the living God
- John 5:1-23 [18, 21] – they sought to kill Him because He called Himself God
- Philippians 2:5-8 – existed in the form of God
- John 11:25-27 – I AM the resurrection and the life
- Mark 4:35-41 [39] – He rebuked the wind
- Zechariah 6:12-13 – it is He who will build the temple of the Lord
